Valerie J. Kuck Receives 1999 Shirley B. Radding Award

Valerie J. Kuck is the 1999 Shirley B. Radding Award recipient. She received her B.A. in Chemistry from Saint Mary of the Woods College in Indiana and a M.S. from Purdue University. She spent most of her career at Bell Laboratories in Murray Hill, NJ. Her early work involved fundamental studies and included a collaboration with ACS President Ed Wasserman on elucidating the structure of short-lived organic intermediates. Later, she focused on more applied areas developing a novel technique for characterizing solder alloys used on printed circuit boards. She generated a procedure for reproducibly measuring the oxidative stability of polyolefins used as copper insulation. This work became the basis of an ASTM test. Recently, she developed technology for determining adhesion of optical fiber coatings.



For the past twenty-four years, Valerie has served as a Councilor from the North Jersey Section. She was chair of the section when it was awarded the Outstanding Section Award and for the past six years has organized the section's National Chemistry Week activities. These events won two Phoenix Awards. She has chaired four national committees and is currently the chair of the Committee on Economic and Professional Activities. At National Meetings she has organized three widely attended special presidential symposia on High Tc Superconductors, Cold Fusion, and Buckyballs. She was co-founder of the Metro Women's Chemist Group. She is currently local section career coordinator.

Shirley Radding will personally present the award to Ms. Kuck at the Spring 2000 ACS National Meeting in San Francisco.
